Three Words That Summarize What the Bible Teaches About a Marriage That Lasts

Word #1: Faithfulness

Malachi 2:13-14 (NIV): ...You flood the LORD's altar with tears. You weep and wail because he no longer looks with favor on your offerings or accepts them with pleasure from your hands. You ask, "Why?" It is because the LORD is the witness between you and the wife of your youth. You have been unfaithful to her, though she is your partner, the wife of your marriage covenant.

Jeremiah 34:18 (NIV): "Those who have violated my covenant and have not fulfilled the terms of the covenant they made before me, I will treat like the calf they cut in two and then walked between its pieces."

Faithfulness builds trust. It says, "I'm not going anywhere."

Word #2: Friendship

Song of Songs 5:16 (NIV 1984): ...This is my lover, this my friend...

Exodus 33:11 (NIV 1984): The LORD would speak to Moses face to face, as a man speaks with his friend...
